

Our first stop was Negril, on the western edge of the island. The area is famous for its black cliffs, Rick's Cafe and Seven Mile Beach, while the city is known for its laid-back, anything-goes vibe. Once a quiet corner of Jamaica, Negril has been transformed by a plethora of large resorts; Sandals, Riu, Breezes and Hedonism, among others, all sit side by side on the luxurious stretch of Seven Mile Beach.

The lobby of the **Breezes Grand** is an expansive open-air rotunda where a gentle breeze wafts through keeping guests cool and comfortable. Resort staff greeted us with smiles and cocktails as we waited to check in. The formalities quickly over, within minutes we'd shed our travel clothes for bathing suits and had our first experience of Seven Mile Beach. Voted No. 4 on the list of the world's best beaches by TripAdvisor, it didn't disappoint.

Whether you're planning a honeymoon or complete destination wedding. Jamaica's all-inclusive luxury resorts have much to offer. At Breezes, the rooms are spacious, clean and comfortable. The food is excellent, plentiful and with five different on-site restaurants, we were treated to a different menu every night. And, of course, the drinks and entertainment were lively and constant. The local reggae influence is everywhere and it feels as if every Jamaican has been given the gift of music and dance.

The island nation also boasts one of the richest and most varied landscapes in the Caribbean, with waterfalls, springs, rivers and streams all flowing from the mountains down to the sea, so if you prefer not to be resort bound, you can choose activities like river rafting, waterfall climbing and horseback riding. Of course, if you'd rather just rock the day away in a hammock under a palm, this is the place to live that dream.

the weekly routine. Each resort has its own wedding concierge and offers package themes ranging from simple to sublime, with
oceanside gazebos, sandy beaches and manicured lawns allowing for a variety of
ceremony styles. Complimentary wedding packages require a minimum number
of room nights booked and you can add on, depending on your needs.


Sandals has long offered a variety of wedding packages including its now-famous Martha Stewart-branded weddings. With a minimum stay of six nights, you can enjoy their basic Beautiful Beginnings package at no extra cost, or you can choose from a variety of themes. Themed packages include all you would expect from Sandals and Martha Stewart, ranging from "Flutter of White," featuring white styling and a butterfly release, starting at US\$1,600, all the way up to their "Island Paradise" theme at US\$3,200. Most packages include the basics, such as ceremony officiants, flowers, cake and reception meal, but expect to pay extra for a photographer or videographer.

After six days of fun and relaxation, we were ready for the next leg of our adventure. The day before we left, I negotiated a private taxi ride to **Bluefields Bay Villas** from the group of taxis permanently stationed outside our resort and, a little too early the next morning, we set off.

Although we had pored over photos before leaving Vancouver, nothing prepared us for the unique experience of Bhiefields Bay Villas. After the hustle and bustle of Negril, a short distance south, Bhiefields offered a welcome retreat into Jamaica's colonial past.

Privately owned and operated by the Virginia-based Moncure family, the villas are a jewel not to be missed. Four of the private villas have been lovingly restored from original estate homes, while two are newly designed and absolutely unique in their approach to the local landscape. Perched on the edge of the Caribbean and brimming with local colonial antiques scoured from across the island, each villa evokes a different feel and look.

Enormous four-poster beds, complete silver service at every meal, private pools and every wall covered in original local art from antique to contemporary complete the experience and offer a feast for the eyes. We felt genuinely immersed in a time long ago.

But the heart of the Bluefields experience is the personal service. Our villa, Mullion Cove, the original property purchased by the Moncures, was staffed with six personnel continually at our service, including our own chef and personal headman or butter. Each meal was a personalized gournet experience. Our laundry was done daily appearing clean and folded in neat stacks on our bed by mid-afternoon; our own security person and daytime driver left nothing to chance. Our headman, Aldeen, was the highlight of our visit — constantly vigilant, Aldeen looked after our every whim from the time we woke in the morn-

ing until late in the evening. Discreet but always attentive, the service was outstanding, including a silver tray of cocktails or appetizers waiting for us at just the right moment.

If you're dreaming of a wedding with a uniquely Caribbean at-home feel, Bluefields Bay offers a truly oncein-a-lifetime experience for you and your guests. Imagine your own private villa overlooking the Caribbean Sea, a lawn festooned with tea lights, a gazebo perched on the water, a reggae band to dance the night away and you may come close to the actual experience. Best suited for wedding parties from six to 40, the villas can be rented individually or in groups, depending on the size of your party. The staff can arrange almost everything required for a local wedding, including officials, florals, cake, music and photographer. And our own experience tells us the service and the food will be outstanding, M
